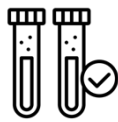
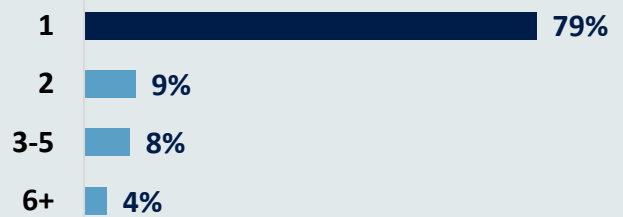
Graduate Health and Wellness Survey 2025 (N= 316)

Key Insights:

- ✓ 68% of graduate students have had **sexual intercourse** since August 2024.
- ✓ 18% of students reported **never** having **any type of sex**.
- ✓ 65% of students have **not been tested for sexually transmitted infections (STIs)** within the last year (among sexually active).
- ✓ 40% of graduate students use **some form of birth control other than condoms**. Popular forms of birth control include oral contraceptive pills and intrauterine devices.
- ✓ 46% of **woman identifying** students use a form of **birth control** (not including condoms).

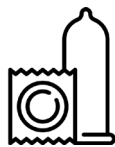
68% of graduate students have had **sexual intercourse since August 2024;**

Among those, number of sexual partners:



65% of graduate students have **not been tested for STIs** within the last year (among sexually active since August 2024)

47% of students know they can get **STI testing** at Campus Health **without details showing on their Bursar account**



53% of graduate students **usually or always** use a condom (among sexually active)
